The Work-Family Research Idea Incubator Workshop will feature accomplished work-family scholars from multiple disciplines providing developmental feedback in an informal, collegial roundtable setting on research that is in its formative stages. Each roundtable will have one or more facilitators to provide feedback and lead discussions on a small number of early-stage research papers, allowing plenty of time for interactions among participants at each table. Regardless of whether you are a junior, mid-career or senior researcher, this workshop offers you an invaluable opportunity to receive detailed feedback from experienced scholars. Your overview statement should include the following:

(1) a cover page including the paper title, as well as your name, institution, discipline (e.g., sociology, economics, management), and contact information;

(2) a brief abstract (250 words or less) that describes your topic and the type of advice you seek.

Optional additional materials of up to 1500 words, including the conceptual framework, research questions, methods, anticipated contributions to research/practice, references and results if available, may be included, but are not required.
