Contributing to the WFC allows you to target your work to just the right audience. Your contributions will be highlighted on the website, and in a monthly email digest sent to our interdisciplinary and international members. This way, you advertise your work outside of your discipline or home country.

Open Access

Another benefit of our research repository is providing access to cutting-edge research beyond the US and the academy. Both scholars and the public can sometimes find it difficult to access journal publications or other research documents. Your contribution to the WFC helps to broaden access to research materials around the world.

Copyright Guidelines

While many publication outlets welcome contributions to non-profit, public-access repositories like ours, copyright issues associated with contributing to the WFC can vary. This is why we provide as much information as we can about how to assess the potential for copyright problems associated with a contribution to the WFC.



Work and Family Commons (WFC) is the open access subject matter repository of the Work and Family Researchers Network, created to gather and preserve the intellectual output of the work and family research community and to offer immediate, permanent and free online access to the full text of research articles for anyone, worldwide.

WFC houses an interdisciplinary collection of research reports, journal articles, conference papers, presentations, books, book chapters, and working papers. Materials are submitted directly by authors with a WFRN account, including faculty, researchers, staff, and other contributors. Anyone with an interest in this area is welcome to access and explore the materials gathered here free of charge.

Maintaining a central repository of work and family scholarship encourages the exchange of high-quality research across disciplines and promotes increased collaboration between work and family academics worldwide.

- You can also discuss any copyright issues with the editor of your publication before submitting to our non-profit, public-access research repository

Information Required for Submission

Before you begin, please be sure you have the following items available:

- The bibliographic information for your submission
- An abstract of your document
- A PDF version of your permissible document. Check the copyright guidelines

Submission Instructions

Submitting authors must first create an account to login to the site. The submission process consists of the following steps:

- Provide information about your submission (see below)
- Read and accept the Submission Agreement
- Upload your PDF file

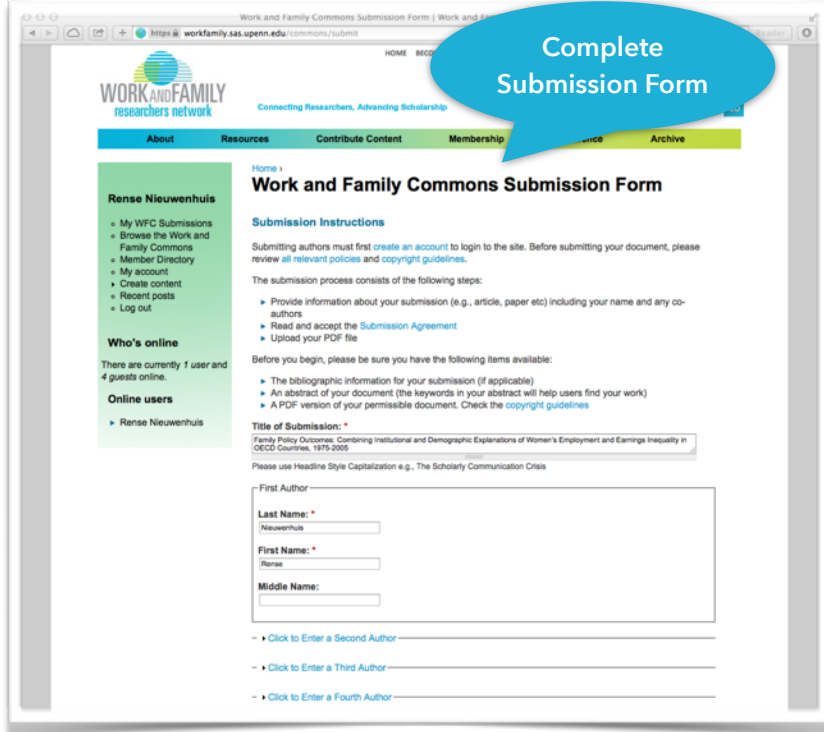
